1. Key highlights


Highlight 1: COVID-19 Cases, Deaths and Laboratory Testing

- Cumulative total of **33,620 confirmed** cases and **798 deaths** (CFR 2.4%) reported since March 2020
- Cumulative total of 455,776 laboratory tests (RT PCR) performed, with a 7.4% Positivity Rate
- Total of 8,047 new laboratory tests (RT PCR) performed during the week with positivity rate of 0.9%
- Less new confirmed cases (71) reported during the week, compared to those reported in the previous week (113 new cases), showing a 37.2% decrease
- Two (02) new deaths reported during the week, an decrease in number from 04 deaths reported in the previous week
- No new cases or deaths reported among healthcare workers during the week
- Cumulative total of 3,351 confirmed cases among healthcare workers

Weekly trend of COVID-19 Confirmed Cases





Key interventions

Surveillance

- Conducted training on Event Based Surveillance (EBS) for facility Health Care Workers, Council and Region Health Management Teams. A total of 146 members were trained.
- Continued with follow-up of daily submission of COVID-19 line-lists from regions.

Points of Entry

- Screening was done at Points of Entry, whereby a total of 123,449 travelers were screened, of whom 29,233 (23.7%) were International travelers, 84,141 (68.2%) domestic travelers and 10,110 (8.6%) were crew members. Of the screened travelers, 6,283 (8.2%) were screened for COVID 19 using a rapid antigen test
- Verification of COVID 19 certificates was performed to overcome the challenge of counterfeit certificates, whereby a total of 18,363 certificates were verified.

Logistics

- Continued registering health care workers on electronic COVID-19 PORTAL system that allows them to report on the availability of covid-19 health commodities.
- Updated users and facility information about the COVID-19 portal system and its application.
- Followed-up on the number of registered health facilities that reports on the COVID PORTAL
- Received and analyzed reports on the availability of health commodities from registered health facilities on COVID-19 PORTAL.
- Prepared for training on installation and maintenance of ventilators donated by GIZ.

Continuation of essential Health Services

• Continued monitoring public and private Hospitals as they attend patients and provide reports all while adhering to COVID-19 precautions.

Vaccination

- Distributed COVID-19 vaccines to Dar es salaam and Lindi regions
- Followed up and entered backload data for COVID-19 vaccination in the Chanjo Covid system conducted, also addressing challenges on the ground including training DIVO's and IT personnel.
- Distributed Vaccines for routine immunization to all regions for the first quarter (January – March 2022) and distributed COVID-19 vaccines to Pwani, Tabora, Kigoma, Mara and Simiyu regions.
