- ✚ One (1) new COVID-19 confirmed cases and no death were reported this week making a cumulative number of **712** COVID- 19 cases and 37 deaths, additionally two (2) probable cases were reported making a cumulative of **390** probable cases since 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021.
- ✚ Number of confirmed cases remain the same this week as the last week.
