## **COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT: NO. 31**

From 09th to 15th April, 2022

### 1. Key highlights


### **Highlight 1: COVID-19 Cases, Deaths and Laboratory Testing**

- Cumulative total of 33,864 confirmed cases and 803 deaths (CFR 2.4%) reported since March 2020
- Cumulative total of 505,799 Laboratory tests (RT PCR) performed, with a 6.7% Positivity Rate
- Total of 4,869 new laboratory tests (RT PCR) performed during the week with a
  positivity rate of 0.3%
- Less new confirmed cases (13) were reported during the week, compared to those reported in the previous week (15 new cases), showing a 13.3% decrease
- No new deaths were reported during the week.
- No new cases or deaths were reported among healthcare workers during the week
- Cumulative total of **3,351** confirmed cases among healthcare workers
- One (1) new admitted patients were reported in the week and all were unvaccinated.

• Cumulative total of **3,584,674** people fully vaccinated to-date

Weekly trend of COVID-19 Confirmed Cases from 03 Dec to 15th April, 2022





## Key interventions Surveillance

- Conducted training for piloting COVID-19 App in Katavi
- Conducted country annual IDSR meeting and disseminated the upgraded eIDSR system which align with the 3<sup>rd</sup> Edition of IDSR Guidelines and introduction of new eIDSR android App
- Trained Community Health Care Workers on Event Based Surveillance in Kilimanjaro Region.
- Continued with follow-up of daily submission of COVID-19 line-lists and alerts from the regions.

### Risk Communication and Community Engagement (RCCE)

- Continued community-based initiatives countrywide through community outreach programs which are being implemented engaging vaccinators, Community Health Workers and other community influencers to promote and enable community uptake of COVID-19 vaccines. Currently, these initiatives are enhanced in 16 regions through USAID and CDC support.
- Continued implementation of a strategy to reach out to places of work and Institutions
  to provide opportunity for workers and employees to receive COVID-19 health
  education and COVID-19 vaccines services to those who consent while at their places
  of work.
- Finalized the standardized National Risk Communication and Community Engagement Strategic Framework Guide which will guide aspects of RCCE coordination, resource allocation and prioritization of activities at different levels and role of key RCCE actors and partners during response to COVID-19 as well as preparedness and response to other public health emergencies.
- Conducted national faith-based leaders' engagement for orientation and seeking their insights on how religious platforms can be further utilized to promote acceptance, trust and continued uptake of COVID-19 vaccines. The meeting will take place on 12<sup>th</sup> April, 2022 engaging national level religious leaders and officials from Ministry of Health, WHO and UNICEF.

### **Points of Entry**

 Screening of travelers at Points of Entry was done. A total of 122,059 travelers were screened, of whom 30,187 (24.7%) were international travelers, 80,642 (66.1%)

- domestic and 11,230 (9.2%) were crew members. Out of the travelers, 1,793 (1.4%) were screened for COVID 19 using a rapid antigen test.
- Verification of COVID 19 certificates was performed to overcome the challenge of counterfeit certificates. A total of 118,313 5,325 certificates and none of them were counterfeit.

### Logistics

- Facilitated importation of donated COVID-19 health commodities.
- Received and analyzed reports on the availability of COVID-19 health commodities from registered health facilities on COVID PORTAL.
- Followed-up on the number of registered health facilities that report on the COVID PORTAL.

 Planning for Phase two survey of the Quality assessment of the impact of COVID-19 to essential health services following completion of Phase One.
