A. COVID – 19 Situation – Summary highlights

- Fifteen (15) new COVID-19 confirmed cases were reported this week making a cumulative number at 360 COVID- 19 confirmed cases since 31st March 2021.
- No death (o) of confirmed or probable COVID-19 case was reported this week remaining with a cumulative number at 67 deaths of confirmed and probable COVID-19 cases since the start of a pandemics.
- 4 No (0) COVID-19 confirmed patients currently admitted
- C19 vaccination ongoing, a total of 33,755 people have been vaccinated to a full dose at Unguja and Pemba

C. Issues & challenges:

- Inadequate COVID-19 RDTs for rapid testing of patients hospitalized/admitted cases due to supplier issues
- Inadequate oxygen supply at MMH due to inadequate production with increased demands.
- Delaying in updating COVID-19 vaccine information from the mass vaccination campaigns from districts due to significant existence of backlog of forms at the vaccination centers
- Shortage of electronic device to support online traveller surveillance system and simplify data collection, recording and reporting at all PoEs due to inadequate funding
- Non functionality of Walkthrough thermo scaners at Malindi seaport, funds secured to support maintenance at the end of this week



D. Summary of Pillar updates

a) Coordination

- Coordinate meeting with District Health Management Teams (DHMT), Vaccine pillar and Risk Communication and Community Engagement (RCCE) to plan strategies to improve uptake of COVID-19 Vaccine in the community
- Preparation is underway for the revision of 3rd version of COVID-19 Response Plan

b) Surveillance and border health screening

- Supportive supervision on IDSR at health facilities (Public and Private health facilities)
 Unguja and Pemba
- In collaboration with ICT department, the MoH is planning to conduct a required stakeholder's meeting on eIDSR system in Zanzibar
- c) Case management
- Distribute oxygen cylinders and monitors among health facilities that cares for COVID-19 cases
- The MoH have receive 4 ventilators from Boresha Afya Project, USAID support on improving COVID-19 patient care at MMH

d) Laboratory

- Reviewing and updating COVID-19 testing algorithm using COVID-19 RDT in Zanzibar
- Conducted an assessment and evaluation on C19 testing to ZanMedics, an identified private partner who will be supporting traveler's testing and screening at screening point

e) Risk communication and community engagement - RCCE

- Continued conducting TV and radio live sessions addressing circulating COVID-19 vaccine misinformation and myth at ZBC TV and Radio, Island TV, Hits FM Radio
- Continued engaging community through Bonanza and potential public gathering using mobile van in Unguja and Pemba with more fucus on vaccinating Elderly, HCWs and vulnerable such as Methadone clinics



Conducted school health education in 5 school including Lumumba Secondary school, Makadara primary school, Mwera School and Mwakaje School

f) COVID-19 Vaccine

- With TA from WHO & UNICEF, COVID-19 Vaccine Operational Guideline was developed to support upscale of C19 vaccination in the isles
- Expand COVID-19 vaccine center have been increased from traditional 14 to 38 where 12 are in Pemba and 26 in Unguja
- Orientation of HCWs on COVID-19 vaccination, management and reporting system in all
 Vaccine centers Unguja and Pemba is underway

E. Logistics Medical Store

- Received 2000 pcs of examination gloves and 1875 pcs of Ag rapid tests from Central Medical Stores.
- Distributed 40 pcs of VTMs and 100 pcs of examination gloves at Mfikiwa COVID 19 center at Pemba.
- Distributed 2000 pcs of VTMs and 1300 pcs of examination gloves and 150 pcs of rapid test at Lumumba COVID 19 centers and 2300 pcs of Ag rapid tests at Air ports

F. Conclusion & recommendations

The COVID-19 pandemics continued to be a threat for the general public as well as specific vulnerable groups on the isles, hence MoH continue to urge community members on using available public health measures such as **wearing of Mask, avoid unnecessary gathering, WASH interventions and use of C19 vaccine**.
